And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father; who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified; who spoke by the prophets. Teach me to treat all that comes to me throughout the day with peace of soul and with firm conviction that Your will governs all. In all my deeds and words, guide me thoughts and feelings. In unforeseen events, let me not forget that all are sent by You. Teach me to act firmly and wisely, without embittering and embarrassing others. Give me strength to bear the fatigue of the coming day with all that it shall bring. Direct my will, teach me to pray, and, Yourself, pray in me. Amen.

#### Noon:

God and Lord of hosts and Maker of all creation, who in the tender compassion of Your unfathomable mercy sent down Your Only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, for the salvation of our race, and by His precious Cross tore apart the handwriting of our sins and thereby triumphed over the principalities and powers of darkness: Do You Yourself, O man-befriending Master, accept also from us sinners these prayers of thanksgiving and supplication; and deliver us from every destructive and dark transgression, and from all enemies both visible and invisible that seek to do us harm. Nail down our flesh with the fear of You, and incline not our hearts unto words or thoughts of evil, but pierce our souls with longing for You, so that ever looking to You, the Unapproachable and Everlasting Light, we may send up unceasing praise and thanksgiving unto You, the Father who is without beginning, with Your Only-begotten Son, and Your all-holy, good, and life-creating Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

# Evening:

I ord, now let Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word, for my eyes have seen Your salvation which You have prepared before the face of all people, a light to enlighten the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel.
