To Our Guests and Visitors about Receiving Holy Communion:

- 1. In Orthodox churches, Holy Communion is given to and received only by members of the Orthodox Church (the baptized and chrismated who strive to live in repentance, faith, and godliness).
- If you are non-Orthodox, please refrain from approaching the Chalice, but speak
 with Fr. Jonathan after the Liturgy. If you are Orthodox and unfamiliar to the
 Priest, please introduce yourself to Fr. Jonathan prior to the Liturgy, otherwise at
 the Chalice.
- 3. Please approach the Chalice in the following order: children first; then rowby-row from the front of Church, going to the Chalice on the side you are positioned (if there are two Chalices), returning to your place by the outside aisle past the table with the *antidoron* (bread and wine).

Prokeimenon Tone 8 (Resurrection)

Pray and make your vows / before the Lord, our God! (Ps. 75:10a) V. In Judah God is known; His Name is great in Israel. (Ps. 75:1)

1 Corinthians 3:9-17 (Epistle)

For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, you are God's building. According to the grace of God which was given to me, as a wise master builder I have laid the foundation, and another builds on it. But let each one take heed how he builds on it. For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. If anyone's work which he has built on it endures, he will receive a reward. If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire. Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are.

Matthew 14:22-34 (Gospel)

Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away. And when He had sent the multitudes away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. Now when evening came, He was alone there. But the boat was now in the middle of the sea, tossed by the waves, for the wind was contrary. Now in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out for fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid." And Peter answered Him and said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." So He said, "Come." And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!" And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, "Truly You are the Son of God." When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennesaret.

^{*} The holy Apostle Bartholomew (Heb., *Bar Tolmai*, that is, "son of Tolmai"; Matt. 10:3) died by crucifixion in Armenia (June 11). The faithful placed his body in a lead coffin and hid it in Urbanopolis. Because healings were constantly being worked by the saint's relics, the pagans threw the coffin in the sea, but the coffin floated. Crossing the Black Sea and the Hellespont, St. Bartholomew's relics passed through the Aegean and the Adriatic and came to rest on the coast of the island of Lipari. The saint appeared in a dream to the local Bishop Agathon alerting him to his coffin which was eventually interred in a church on an islet near Lipari. When the island was captured by the Arabs in the early ninth century, Christians went from Amalfi to take the coffin. In 983, St. Bartholomew's relics were taken to an island in the Tiber River at Rome.

^{*} The holy Apostle Titus was the spiritual son of the Apostle Paul and Bishop of Gortyna on the island of Crete. St. Titus, of Gentile and pagan origin, was left uncircumcised in the flesh to prove the freedom of the Gospel (Gal. 2:3), and he became a travelling companion and emissary for the Apostle Paul. Being with St. Paul during his first imprisonment in Rome, St. Titus accompanied him when he went back east, staying on Crete to supervise the organization of the Church there. Bishop Titus fell asleep in peace, and his body was placed in the cathedral at Gortyna, his episcopal seat. When the island was liberated from its Arab occupiers, both the capital and cathedral (the relics of St. Titus) were moved to Candaque; this church remained the principal pilgrimage center during the Venetian occupation (1210-1669). Driven from Crete by the Turks, the Venetians took the skull of St. Titus to St. Mark's Basilica in Venice, from which it was returned to the Church of Crete on May 12, 1966.
