To Our Guests and Visitors about Receiving Holy Communion:

- 1. In Orthodox churches, Holy Communion is given to and received only by members of the Orthodox Church (the baptized and chrismated who strive to live in repentance, faith, and godliness).
- If you are non-Orthodox, please refrain from approaching the Chalice, but speak
 with Fr. Jonathan after the Liturgy. If you are Orthodox and unfamiliar to the
 Priest, please introduce yourself to Fr. Jonathan prior to the Liturgy, otherwise at
 the Chalice.
- 3. Please approach the Chalice in the following order: children first; then rowby-row from the front of Church, going to the Chalice on the side you are positioned (if there are two Chalices), returning to your place by the outside aisle past the table with the *antidoron* (bread and wine).

For not even those who are circumcised keep the law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may boast in your flesh. But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but a new creation. And as many as walk according to this rule, peace and mercy be upon them, and upon the Israel of God. From now on let no one trouble me, for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus. Brethren, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen.

Luke 13:10-17 (Gospel)

Now He was teaching in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath. And behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bent over and could in no way raise herself up. But when Jesus saw her, He called her to Him and said to her, "Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity." And He laid His hands on her, and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God. But the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath; and he said to the crowd, "There are six days on which men ought to work; therefore come and be healed on them, and not on the Sabbath day." The Lord then answered him and said, "Hypocrite! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or donkey from the stall, and lead it away to water it? So ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound – think of it – for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath?" And when He said these things, all His adversaries were put to shame; and all the multitude rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by Him.

She brings with her the grace of the <u>Spirit</u>, therefore, the angels of God <u>praise</u> her:// "Truly this woman is the abode of <u>Heaven!</u>"

^{*} Catherine was the daughter of a wealthy patrician in the Egyptian capital of Alexandria. She was known for her noble birth, exceeding beauty, and very learned intelligence. By the time she was eighteen, the most learned scholars were in awe of her accomplishments. Refusing all suitors not equal to her pursuit of purity, Catherine's mother, a secret Christian, sent her to seek the advice of a Christian ascetic who told her the only Spouse she should seek is the Creator and Master of the universe, the Son and Word of God. Catherine abandoned all to follow Christ. When the Emperor Maxentius (305-311) ordered his subjects to offer sacrifices to idols, Catherine denounced his errors with unassailable arguments, shaming 50 of his wisest scholars in debate. The emperor ordered the 50 men to be burned who, by Catherine's prayers, all confessed the name of Christ before their execution. Catherine was thrown into prison and tortured, converting the emperor's wife, close friend Porphyrius, and 200 soldiers to the true Faith, who then all suffered for Christ. The holy martyr Catherine was eventually beheaded at the age of 18. Her miracle-working relics reside in the monastery on Mount Sinai now bearing her name.
