2. **If you are not a member of the Orthodox Church**, please refrain from approaching the Chalice for Communion. Instead, you are welcome to receive some of the blessed bread (*antidoron*) from a small side table, and introduce yourself to Fr. Jonathan following the Liturgy.

for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.



Luke 18:10-14 (Gospel)

THE 2026 LENTEN SEASON

Today we begin the Lenten season in the Orthodox Church, 10 weeks before Pascha, the Feast of our Lord's Resurrection from the dead. This year Pascha is on Sunday, April 12, the first Sunday after the first full moon (Jewish Passover) after the first day of Spring (April 2, on the Julian [Old] Calendar). The Old English word *Lent* means "springtime."

Following is the schedule of the Orthodox Lenten season:

1. Pre-Lent (3 weeks)

Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee (*fast-free week*)
 Sunday of the Prodigal Son
 Sunday of the Last Judgment (*meatfare* – farewell to meat)
 Forgiveness Sunday/Expulsion of Adam from Paradise (*cheesefare* – farewell to cheese & dairy)

2. Great Lent (40 days)

1st week (begins on Monday, Feb. 23)
 Great Canon of St. Andrew of Crete/Presanctified Liturgy
 1st Sunday: Orthodoxy/Restoration of Icons (2nd week)
 Memorial Saturday
 2nd Sunday: St. Gregory Palamas (3rd week)
 Memorial Saturday
 3rd Sunday: Veneration of the Cross (4th week)
 Memorial Saturday
 4th Sunday: St. John of the Ladder (5th week)
 Thursday of the Great Canon/Life of St. Mary of Egypt
 Saturday of the Akathist (to the Theotokos)
 5th Sunday: St. Mary of Egypt
 Last day of Lent (Friday, April 3)

3. Holy Week (April 4-11)

Raising of Lazarus (Lazarus Saturday)
 Entrance into Jerusalem (Palm Sunday)
 Teaching in the Temple (Monday-Wednesday)
 Institution of Lord's Supper/Arrest in Gethsemane (Thurs.)
 Crucifixion and Burial (Friday)
 Sabbath in the Tomb/Descent into Hades (Saturday)

4. HOLY PASCHA (Feast of feasts; April 12)

Midnight Office/Matins/Divine Liturgy (blessing of baskets)
 Paschal Vespers (and egg hunt)
